DISABILITY ACCESS FOR SUNBELT EXPO

A SPECIAL ENTRANCE at the Expo has been designated for physically disabled visitors. Please go to Gate 3, and proceed to the orange ticket sales booth near the south end of WC-7 in the exhibit grounds. The hard-surface parking area at Gate 3 will provide the easiest access onto the grounds.

The Expo allows wheelchairs, both manual and electric. The use of golf carts, riding mowers, ATVs, or any other type of motorized vehicles is prohibited. Electric scooters, electric wheelchairs, and manual wheelchairs are available for rent at the Expo from Scootaround. They are located in section WC-7 (near Gate 3 – Handicap Parking). Permanent restrooms on the grounds are also accessible to the disabled.
